### **Foreword EHF President**

#### Dear handball friends,

It is a real privilege for me to welcome supporters, players, officials and partners back to the EHF Champions League Women for 2023/24 where, after the mid-season break, the group phase is ready to continue and reach its dramatic conclusion!

Eight rounds of group phase fixtures are in the books with six more still to go, meaning we are still quite a way off the EHF FINAL4 2024, but thanks to our partners, our fantastic players and you, our terrific fans, it is clear that the EHF and EHF Marketing are delivering a showpiece club competition that remains the leading women's indoor sports competition in Europe. I hope that you all have been as thrilled by the EHF Champions League Women as I have so far.

A mark of a strong competition in any sport is how evenly-matched the teams are, and the EHF Champions League Women certainly ticks that box! After eight rounds of matches, only one team remains unbeaten, Hungarian powerhouse Györi Audi ETO KC. They have won all their matches so far and thus sit atop group A. Odense Håndbold and SG BBM Bietigheim have also had a great first half of the campaign, but there is still plenty of time for the other teams to catch them! In group B, Team Esbjerg leads the way, followed by Metz Handball and Ikast Handbold. Then come four teams all on seven points - it really is set to go down to the wire!

Denmark's Ikast Handbold are the current champions of the EHF European League Women, having taken the title at the EHF Finals Women 2023 in Graz, Austria. Stories such as theirs show the strength in depth of women's European club handball, not just in the EHF Champions League, but across all competitions. Current three-time EHF Champions League Women champions Vipers Kristiansand sit fourth in group B, an indicator of how tough this year's competition is, and how it is going from strength to strength.

The EHF Champions League Women has been on a break since mid-November, as many players have been on duty for their national teams at the 2023 IHF Women's World Championship. Having watched the stars shine for their countries, it is now time for them to do the same with their clubs as the focus returns to the premier club competition, and with so many of the world's very best players taking part in both events, it goes to show that the EHF Champions League Women is truly the pinnacle of our sport at club level.

On behalf of the EHF and EHF Marketing, I hope that you enjoy the conclusion of the group phase, and beyond, in 2024.

### **DVSC SCHAEFFLER**

This will be only the second season in history for the Hungarian side in the European premium competition, after they made their debut in the 2010/11 season. In their previous appearance, DVSC SCHAEFFLER only won a single game, at home, against Hypo losing other five. DVSC last qualified for the knockout phase of an European competition in 2011/12 season, when they reached the quarter-finals of the Cup Winner's Cup. Debrecen brought in five new players, including line player Tamara Haggerty from HH Elite and rightback Elinore Johansson from Storhamar, with six other players leaving over the summer. Several young talented Hungarian players, like Gréta Kácsor and Petra Füzi-Tóvizi are the cornerstones of DVSC and crucial to the team's success.

### ODENSE HÅNDBOLD

Odense Håndbold reached the quarter-finals of the EHF Champions League Women for the second time in their history last year. Now, under three-time winning coach Ole Gustav Gjekstad, the Danish runners-up (to Team Esbjerg) are looking to go a step further.

A new-look squad will don the famous orange jerseys while still retaining the characteristic Odense mix of Scandinavian and Dutch players.

#### MAIN FACTS

- > this will be the fifth season for Odense in the EHF Champions League Women and their fourth consecutive appearance, having reached the quarter-finals last season.
- > the summer has been busy for Odense, with seven players leaving, including experienced left back Lois Abbingh and line player Rikke Iversen, and eight players being ushered in.
- > coach Ulrik Kirkely left to join Györ, with three-time winner of the EHF Champions League Women, Ole Gustav Gjekstad, being signed from reigning champions Vipers Kristiansand.
- > the Danish side needs only 230 goals to reach the 2,000-goal milestone and become the 22nd team in history to hit that number.
- > Odense have won seven, eight and nine games respectively in the previous three seasons, a step-by-step improvement, but have never made the EHF FINAL4 in their previous four seasons in the European premium competition.
